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ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION.

BE IT KNOWN, that the subscribers, citizens of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, having associated themselves together for the purpose and upon the terms and by the name hereinafter set forth, and being desirous of becoming incorporated agreeably to the provisions of the Act of General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, entitled "Non Profit Corporation Law" 1933, P.L. 289, etc. do hereby declare, set forth and certify that the following are the purposes, articles and conditions of their said Association and for and upon which they desire to be incorporated:

1. Name - Pennsylvania Association for Retarded and Handicapped Children.
2. Location - 907, Central Medical Building, 1737 Chestnut Street, Philadelphia 3, Pa.
3. Purpose - To obtain the necessary legislation for the establishment, construction and maintenance at the public expense for free public schools and free institutions in the cities, towns, boroughs and villages; staffed by teachers, instructors, physicians, psychiatrists, psychologists, neurologists, or any other person licensed by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to practice any of the medical professions, nurses and such other persons, especially trained for the purpose of aiding, guiding, instructing, treating and rehabilitating children who are mentally retarded, blind, crippled, deaf, the victims of cerebral palsy, and who may be afflicted in some such similar manner, regardless of their race, creed, color or national origin.

After the legislation aforementioned is obtained and implemented, to aid such schools and institutions as far as possible.

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4. The Corporation shall have perpetual existence.

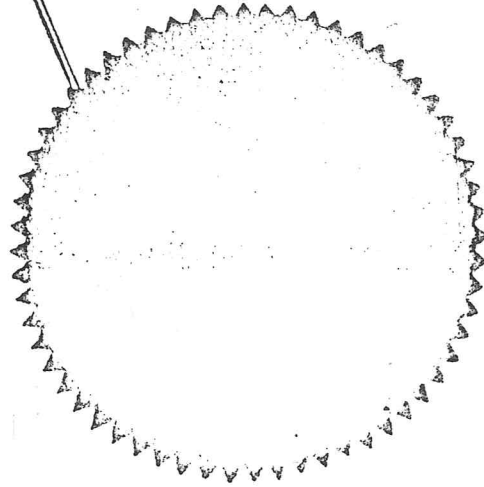

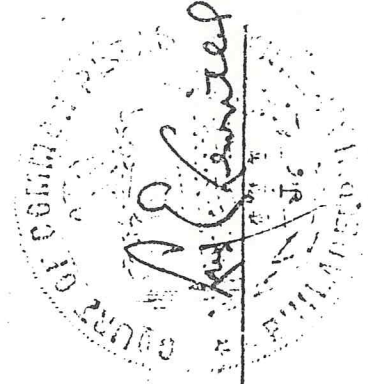

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ARTICLES OF AMENDMENT TO ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

1. The present name of the corporation is: Pennsylvania Association for Retarded and Handicapped Children, Incorporated, and the location of the registered office of said corporation is 907 Central Medical Building, 1737 Chestnut Street, Philadelphia 3, Pennsylvania.

2. Said corporation was incorporated under the Act of General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania ("Non-Profit Corporation Law") of 1933, P.L. 289, etc. The Court entered the decree of incorporation on October 17, 1949. The original articles of incorporation were recorded in the Office of the Recorder of Deeds of the County of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, on October 27, 1949, in 149 Charter Book, page 458, etc.

3. In accordance with the constitution of said corporation, as amended, at a meeting of the State Board of Directors of Pennsylvania Association for Retarded and Handicapped Children held on November 3, 1951, at the Penn-Sheraton Hotel, 39th and Chestnut Streets, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, the amendments to said articles of incorporation as herein below set forth were unanimously adopted and letters of notification were sent by the state secretary of said corporation to the respective presidents of the County branches of said corporation, to wit: Bucks County, Delaware County, Lehigh County, Montgomery County, Northampton County and Philadelphia County, advising them to hold meetings of the general membership of said branches within thirty days from receipt of said letters of notification. At general membership meetings held by said county branches at the places below specified, after at least ten days written notice given to each member of said county branches by the respective county branch secretary, the membership of said county branches unanimously adopted the amendments to the articles of incorporation hereinafter set forth, and the resolution author-

izing this application, on the dates below indicated:

Bucks - Swartzlander Community Bldg., Doylestown, Pa., - December 10, 1951.

Delaware - Yeadon Borough Hall, Yeadon, Pa. - December 4, 1951.

Lehigh - Notre Dame Hall of the Sacred Heart Hospital, Allentown, Pa. - January 18, 1952.

Montgomery - American Legion Post, Norristown, Pa. - December 6, 1951.

Northampton - C. I. O. Hall, Bethlehem, Pa. - December 5, 1951.

Philadelphia - Lincoln Preparatory School, Philadelphia, Pa. - November 15, 1951.

d. To further the training and education of personnel for work in the field of mental retardation;

e. To encourage the formation of parents' groups, to advise and aid parents in the solution of their problems, and to coordinate the efforts and activities of these groups;

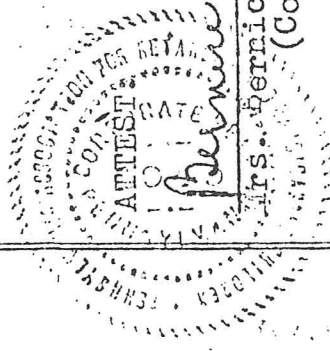

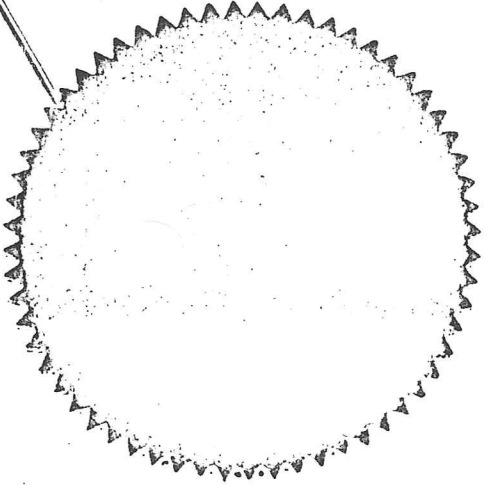
