



Use community input (focus groups) to identify the best ways to create and share health messages and media

PhotoVoice: Sharing Personal Stories

Work with people with intellectual and developmental disabilities and aging adults to co-create targeted, accessible health messages informed by their personal stories to improve communication between care providers and recipients

SAFE: Health Safety Training

Develop a training on Covid-19 safety and prevention strategies to use in the workplace for people with intellectual and developmental disabilities

Reduce Social Isolation

Making the Connection & Combatting Loneliness Through Friendly Visiting

Interventions aimed at reducing social isolation and loneliness for people with disabilities and aging adults

Power of Dependable Souls

Peer-led group intervention to reduce isolation experienced by people with serious mental illness

Train peer support specialists and develop network of providers to run groups around the state

Provide training on model to broader community mental health service providers for other populations
