

IDENTIFYING THE NEED

 WHO defines a disability as any condition of the body or mind (impairment) that makes it more difficult for the person with the condition to do certain activities (activity limitation) and interact with the world around them (participation restrictions).

IDENTIFYING THE NEED

- These patients have a disproportionate amount of dental disease compared to the rest of the adult population.
- Physical, behavioral, emotional, and social barriers continue to prevent thorough and effective oral care plans from being created, understood, and accomplished on a daily basis.



SOCIAL DETERMINANTS OF HEATLH

• Persons with disabilities face multidimensional barriers accessing dental care:

- Dentist's report a lack of preparation to assist people with disabilities
- Structural problems of access to dental offices



- Communication difficulties
- Lack of awareness regarding the need for dental treatment for the disabled person

CHANGING EDUCATIONAL MODELS

- As of August 2019, CODA amended their accreditation standard 2-25: dental school graduates must be competent in the <u>assessment and</u> <u>management</u> of treatment of patients with specialized healthcare needs and disabilities.
- Many of these patients require modified dental care
 - many dental schools lack the facilities to provide both the proper care and education.
 - Practicing providers are often not comfortable treating these patients due to lack of training when in dental school and lack of continuing education opportunities.



IDENTIFYING A SOLUTION: PERSONALIZED CARE SUITE and SPECIALIZED CARE PROGRAM

Cornerstone of an educational program designed to teach dentists,



patients, and caregivers how to utilize best accommodations to optimize oral health through the lifetime.





SPECIALIZED CARE PROGRAM

- Focus on education for every graduating dentist that develops skills in prevention, primary care and maintaining oral health without being dependent on sedation and general anesthesia for the disabled population.
 - It will focus on preventing, reversing and arresting disease through evidence-based interventions in-office and at-home.
- Generate the scientific literature, educational material and educational programs for dental educators, dentists, students, patients and caregivers.

THE SUITE

Large reception area and wide corridors accommodate those using wheelchairs or gurneys

Wayfinding on the floor for the blind

High volume air exchange throughout the suite for clean, scent free air throughout.

Nitrous oxide provided through a HuFriedy gift available all chairs

Computer with every unit for record keeping, patient education, patient comfort







THE SUITE

 6 Open-bay for medically compromised patients who require careful monitoring but not necessarily private room









THE SUITE: 6 ENCLOESED OPERATORIES



- Windows in all rooms with light filter shades and dimmable variable lighting
- Rooms equipped with blackout shades
- Acoustic deadening
- Frosted doors for privacy
- Patient view computer screen and speakers
- Room with observation window
- Cameras and microphones for observing and recording patient encounters





THE SUITE: OVERSIZED OPERATORY

- A-dec cart delivery system so there are no handpieces hanging near patients that might grab things
- Ceiling mounted lighting to allow the room to be modified for treatment
- Space to treat a patient in a hospital bed or on the floor if that is where they prefer!
- Acoustic deadening and dimmable variable lighting









THE SUITE: WHEELCHAIR ACCOMODATION

- A-dec cart delivery system (4 rooms) so there are no handpieces hanging near patients that might grab things
- Ceiling mounted lighting to allow the room to be modified for treatment
- Dental-Ez Hover chair (3 rooms) to allow movement to the side to allow treatment in wheelchair
- Design Specifics wheelchair tilt lift for tipping chairs that cannot recline









THE SUITE: CONSULTATION ROOMS

- Patient and Caregiver Education becomes central to a continuous oral health philosophy of the Center
- Large open consult rooms to allow patients and caregivers to speak with the doctors
- Rooms can be used for desensitization, examination and portable x-ray when patients will not use a "dental" room for their initial examination and some procedures using portable equipment





CONSULTATION ROOMS

- Viewing area of individual room procedures while limiting the number observing directly in a treatment room
- Student education with faculty and residents







A SOLUTION: STUDENT EDUCATION THROUGH DIRECT PATIENT CARE

 clinical rotation one half day per week
- Junior dental students (D3) 4 full day clinical rotations per year assisting and observing
- Oral Medicine Residents 3mo full day rotations

STUDENT EDUCATION THROUGH DIRECT PATIENT CARE

- Provide general dental services
- Utilize four handed dentistry
- Assess oral disease risk and create disease prevention plans











STUDENT EDUCATION THROUGH DIRECT PATIENT CARE

- Train individuals and care givers in proper hygiene techniques
- Train care givers in stabilization techniques for home care







STUDENT EDUCATION THROUGH DIRECT PATIENT CARE

- Administration of Nitrous
 Oxide analgesia
- Provide non-restrictive management techniques
- Learn and provide restrictive treatment modifications such as medical immobilization and protective stabilization



IDENTIFYING A SOLUTION: SYNCHRONOUS TELEDENTISTRY

- Students contact patients and care givers to complete necessary assessments prior to first visit
 - Medical history
 - Consent for care
 - Treatment accommodation needs
 - Interprofessional consultations
 - Patient/student introduction
- Students provide post operative assessments and advice
- Students and faculty review treatment plans with patients and guardians

TELEDENTISTRY

- Students review and observe oral care techniques taught in clinic in the home environment
- Students can teach nurses and aides who provide care in the home the techniques taught in the clinic
- Public Health Dental Hygiene Practitioner supervise fluoride

 Patient navigator can connect patients to resources to improve their clinical experiences and continuity of care



IDENTIFYING A SOLUTION: CONTINUING EDUCATION

- Provide ongoing free continuing education for dentists, hygienists, patients, caregivers and health professionals.
- Various topics related to care of individuals with special care needs.

- Recorded lectures for self study
 - Certificate of Expertise upon completion of 18 hrs.

 - Extractions










WHAT IT IS ALL ABOUT

INITIAL VISIT:

- 38 yr. old male who remains in WHEELCHAIR for treatment.
- Assisted living home. Limited ability to perform ADLs.
- Intake information obtained during TELEDENTISTRY visit 1 month PRIOR
- Mother is legal guardian, consulted via phone for **PERMISSION TO STABILIZE**
- COMPLEX MEDICAL HX including profound intellectual disability, cerebral
 palsy with spastic quadriparesis, microcephaly, stereotypic movement disorder
 with self injurious behaviors, blindness, hearing loss
- Non-verbal. Diet is ground with thin liquids which may be thickened.
- PDH: Tx under GA, last visit 2019
- Tx: Comprehensive exam, TB prophy and gross debridement of moderate to heavy supra and subgingival calculus with generalized inflammation
- Plan: Complete prophy and radiographs to be made with assistance
