At the same time, service providers are closing programs or reducing the number of people they can serve. **These**

decisions also impact families. DSPs provide the care and the services that allow individuals with ID/A to remain at home or in their community. Without these services, some individuals with ID/A, ultimately, will have to live in a nursing home or hospital.

Without DSPs, families are left to provide services on their own and possibly quit their jobs, which puts additional stress on the family economy.
