




the quality or state of being in good health especially as an actively sought goal lifestyles that promote *wellness*

- ➤ PA life expectancy has dropped from 78 to 76 from 2019 to 2021

Pennsylvania BH Spends & Trends

2019 to 2024 \$1.06b to\$3.69b

Pa Ranks #2 in US on % of Population Served < 5%

Pa. Ranks #3 in total Spend \$3.69b

Pa ranks #5 in Per capita Spending

Pa Ranks top 5 in spend per client

Pa considered one of most well resourced States for BH services

Behavioral Health Services in PA

- Full continuum of care for adults, children, and families
- ➤ More than two dozen state licensed programs
- ➤ Categorized by Community Based and Residential
- ➤Outpatient, inpatient, school based, psychiatric, partial hospitalization, crisis services, IBHS
- ➤DHS, Office of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services (OMHSAS), County MH
- Services paid for by private insurance, Medicaid, Medicare, and CHIP
- ➤ More than 3 million Pennsylvanians are on Medicaid (~25%)

Despite our vast and diverse continuum we struggle...

Barriers to Wellness

- ➤ Pa Geography is a major influencer on access
- Rural vs. Suburban vs. Urban does not always tell the full story
- >Access does not always equate to equity
- ➤ Workforce changed as the pandemic unfolded
- ➤ Professional and clinical staff wanted to work from home found
- Telehealth giveth and taketh away

- Wage disparity drove staff out of the workforce Direct Care vs. Sheetz
- Administrative Regulatory burden drive worker to private sector
- Covid related funding going, going gone...
- PA goofed on the Medicaid PHE unwinding
- The New Administration and the Federal uncertainties

Come on up for the rising

- Despite the Challenges we are making gains
- More individuals, children and families serviced in Pa than ever before
- Funding for Human Services and Behavioral Health continues to grow
 - School Based, County MH, Early Intervention
- Telehealth has changed the delivery landscape and it is expanding
- Better understanding in the Pa General Assembly
- Legislation aimed at workforce initiatives
- The State is trying...



We Must Be Better Together

- Continued to understand the population needs through engagement
- Begin to build the workforce infrastructure earlier in the process
- Build network capacity across all regions populations
- Advocate for sustainable and transparent funding models
- Reform regulations that promote flexibility and reduction in administrative burden
- Leverage technology to expand access
- End useless commissions and committees and invest in viable strategic efforts to rebuilding the Pa behavioral health system
- Legislative awareness and accountability to ensure a future for the most vulnerable Pennsylvanians
